- 2,217 individual responses, 17 organisations, plus meeting notes



A wide range of people contributed


- 89% of responses were from the public and 11% from health and care professionals.
- 40% from men, 60% from women, <1% other.
- 2% Asian, 1% Black, 96%
 White, 1% mixed, and <1% other ethnic groups.

Age:

- 28% were 40 or under
- 41% were 41-64 years
- 31% were aged 65+ years

Things to consider about all proposals

Population size / growth / age / take into account holiday makers

Travel

- Safety if travelling further
- Practicality and cost returning home from another hospital
- Inconvenience / stress for patient
- Inconvenience / stress for family / visitors
- Expense of travel
- Environmental impact
- Lack of public transport
- Not enough GPs / difficulty accessing GPs
- Lack of capacity of ambulance service and other hospitals
- Accuracy and feasibility of evidence / statistics

People suggested alternatives to consider

- Alternative proposal: draw on other hospital staff (doctors) in A&E (14%)
- Increase primary care to reduce A&E demand (13%)
- Build large new hospital / expand hospital (11%)
- Walk in clinic in town centre (4%)
- Have minor injuries unit available / better advertised (4%)
- Rotating staff posts / draw on staff from other hospitals (2%)
- Draw on nurse practitioners / junior doctors in A&E (2%)

Things that may be of interest to the Trust

- Around 300 health and care workers provided feedback (243 individual responses plus staff attending meetings).
- Health and care workers were more favourable about the A&E opening hours proposal than others (49% supported this compared to 31% overall)
- People were not asked about the quality of care at Weston General Hospital but 16 responses said something positive about the quality of care (<1%)</p>
- Around one in ten health and care workers mentioned something about more staff engagement or engaging with more diverse groups.
